



VEN. MOTHER MARY VERONICA'S BIRTH BICENTENNIAL (1823-2023)

मदर वेरोनिकाचे जीवन

वेरोनिकाचा जन्म 1823 मध्ये कॉनस्टंनटिनोपल येथे सोफी लीव्हज म्हणून, तेथील ॲंग्लिकन धर्मगुरू हेन्री डॅनियल लीव्हज आणि ब्रिटीश सैन्यातील कर्नलची मुलगी सोफिया मेरी हॉल्टेन यांच्याकडे झाला.

जेव्हा सोफी किशोरवयात होती तेव्हा तिच्यात बदल झाला. तिने प्रार्थनेत बरेच तास घालवले. "ईस्टर मंगळवारी एक गडद रात्र संपली" तेव्हा तिने लिहिले. "मी शेवटच्या मेणबत्त्या विझवल्या. घर स्थिर होते. अचानक एका स्पष्ट पण मऊ आवाजाने शांतता भंग पावली आणि मला हे शब्द स्पष्टपणे ऐकू आले "तुम्हांस शांती असो, माझी शांती मी तुम्हाला देतो". मग जशी रात्री शांतता असते, तशीच शांतता माझ्या हृदयात निर्माण झाली."

रोमन कॅथोलिक चर्च, विशेषतः कन्फेशन आणि होली कम्युनियनच्या संस्कारांकडे सोफी आकर्षित झाली म्हणून तिने नौदल अधिकाऱ्याबरोबर असलेलं आपलं नातं तोडलं त्यामुळे लिव्ह आणि इतर सर्वजण नाराज झाले.

2 फेब्रुवारी 1850 रोजी माल्टा येथे सोफीचे कॅथोलिक चर्चमध्ये स्वागत करण्यात आले. त्यानंतर, ती फ्रान्सला गेली जिथे तिने सिस्टर्स ऑफ सेंट जोसेफ ऑफ द अपेरिशनमध्ये प्रवेश केला, ज्याची स्थापना 1836 मध्ये एमिली डी व्हायलर यांनी सुरू केली होती. नवशिक्या पूर्ण केल्यानंतर, तिला 14 सप्टेंबर 1851 रोजी संस्थेचे सदस्य म्हणून घोषित करण्यात आले आणि तिला सिस्टर मेरी वेरोनिका हे नाव मिळाले.

1862 मध्ये सिस्टर वेरोनिकाला भारतातील संस्थेच्या फाउंडेशनमध्ये शिकवण्यासाठी नेमण्यात आले, तेथे बिशप मेरी अँटोनी यांच्या विनंतीवरून पाठवले गेले, ज्यांनी तरुणांचे शिक्षण धार्मिकतेकडे सोपवण्यासाठी फ्रान्सला मदतीची विनंती केली होती. एक प्राथमिक पाऊल म्हणून त्यांनी 1860 मध्ये कालिकत (आताचे कोझिकोड) येथे एका कॉन्व्हेंटसाठी घर विकत घेतले आणि लोकांच्या विनंतीनुसार 1 एप्रिल 1862 रोजी तेथे शाळा सुरू केली. त्याला सेंट जोसेफ स्कूल म्हणतात. सिस्टर वेरोनिका आणि सिस्टर मेरी जोसेफ, यांनी खडतर प्रवास केल्यानंतर, 27 एप्रिल 1862 रोजी तेथे पोहोचल्या आणि त्यांनी शाळेची जबाबदारी स्वीकारली. तिने कॉन्व्हेंटच्या पहिल्या वरिष्ठ म्हणून काम केले आणि मंगळूर आणि कोझिकोड या दोन्ही ठिकाणी दोन वर्षे अध्यापन केले. तिथेच सिस्टर वेरोनिका धर्मगुरू मेरी एफ्रम यांना भेटले.

धर्मगुरू मेरी एफ्रम ह्यांनी पश्चिम भारतीय चर्चसाठी सेवा देणाऱ्या इतर डिस्क्लेक्ड कार्मेलाईट फादरसह, मुलींना शिकवण्याच्या एका गटाची दीर्घकाळ कल्पना केली होती. तिथेच सिस्टर वेरोनिकाची भारतातील महिला आणि मुलींना शिक्षण देण्यासाठी सिस्टरांना शिकवण्याच्या गटाची कल्पना केली होती. या प्रयत्नाचे नेतृत्व करण्यासाठी सिस्टर वेरोनिका ही एक उत्कृष्ट उमेदवार आहे असे धर्मगुरू मेरी एफ्रम यांना वाटले, ह्याच वेळी अंत: मनातील आवाज ऐकून कार्मेलाइट संस्थेमध्ये सामील होण्यासाठी सिस्टर वेरोनिकाच्या मनात विचार आला.

खूप चिंतन आणि मनस्ताप केल्यावर, सिस्टर वेरोनिकाने असे फाउंडेशन सुरू करण्याची जबाबदारी स्वीकारली. ती सेंट जोसेफच्या सिस्टर्समधून बाहेर पडली आणि फ्रान्सला परतली, जिथे तिने नवशिक्या म्हणून पाँच्या डिस्केल्ड कार्मेलमध्ये प्रवेश केला. तिच्या व्यवसायानंतर, मदर वेरोनिकाने युरोपियन महिलांचा एक छोटासा गट तयार करण्यास सुरुवात केली जी बायोनमधील एका घरात राहून भारतात फाउंडेशन सुरू करण्यासाठी सामील झाल्या होत्या.

16 जुलै 1868 रोजी अवर लेडी ऑफ माउंटच्या कार्मेल मेजवानीला "अपोस्टोलिक कार्मेल" म्हणून ओळखल्या जाणाऱ्या कार्मेलाइट थर्ड ऑर्डर रेग्युलरच्या सिस्टरांची अधिकृतपणे संस्था स्थापन केली.

तीन भगिणींचा एक छोटा गट, मेरी ऑफ द एंजल्सच्या नेतृत्वाखाली भारताला रवाना झाला, ज्यांनी नवीन संस्थेच्या पहिल्या सुपीरियर जनरल आणि नविशक्यांची शिक्षिका म्हणून काम केले. त्या 19 नोव्हेंबर 1870 रोजी भारतात आल्या, त्याच वेळी फादर इफ्रेमची स्थानिक बिशप म्हणून नियुक्ती झाली. त्यांच्या आगमनानंतर लवकरच, सिस्टरांनी मुलींसाठी सेंट ॲन शाळा उघडली.

1873 मध्ये, मदर वेरोनिका तिच्या स्वतःच्या मठात परतली, कार्मेल ऑफ पॉ, जिथे तिचे वयाच्या 83 व्या वर्षी 16 नोव्हेंबर 1906 रोजी निधन झाले.

5 सप्टेंबर 1892 रोजी, मदर वेरोनिका यांनी स्थापित केलेली संस्था औपचारिकपणे Discalced Carmelite ऑर्डरशी संलग्न झाली. त्याची वाढ झाली आहे आणि आता भारत, श्रीलंका, कुवेत, पाकिस्तान, केनिया, रोम आणि बहरीनच्या विविध भागांमध्ये शाखा आहेत. या शाखा सहा प्रांतांतर्गत शासित आहेत आणि केंद्रशासित आहेत.

16 नोव्हेंबर रोजी मदर वेरोनिका यांच्या सणाच्या निमित्ताने सेंट तेरेजा कॉलेजमधील सर्व विद्यार्थी व शिक्षक प्रार्थनेमध्ये सहभागी झाले होते. सर्व प्रथम मदर वेरोनिका बद्दलची प्रस्तावना देण्यात आली त्यानंतर सर्वजण प्रार्थनेमध्ये सहभागी झाले. त्याचबरोबर मदर वेरोनिका यांची व्हिडीओद्वारे जीवन कहानी दाखविण्यात आली होती जेणेकरून सर्वजण त्यांचे चरित्र आत्मसात करतील.



GEMS FROM VENERABLE MOTHER VERONICA

Be constant in prayer: A day without prayer is a day without blessing, and a life without prayer is a life without power. So prayer should be an inseparable part of our life. We should pray not only to ask but also to thank.

As for me, He places me on the cross Always-It is my place until the end of my poor life: Jesus on the cross died for our sins, we cannot repay him but through our good deeds we can make him happy.

It is good to suffer for Jesus and with him: Count it as a singular grace, an extraordinary honour, to be able to suffer and to be despised for Jesus: Jesus has blest us with innumerable grace we need to feel grateful that we are the chosen ones to impart knowledge and spread joy. We need to take up the challenges that come our way.

Be of good courage, the darkness of the night will pass and then joy comes in the morning: There's always a light at the end of the tunnel. We are all faced with ups and downs all we have to do is have patience and let the storm pass and you will come out strong.

Be faithful to the grace which our Lord gives you. There is a pardon for every sin: To err is human to forgive is divine. We don't become small when we accept our mistakes and forgive others. Because if God can forgive, so can we.

We see the faults of the others so well-God forbid that I do worse: Always remember when you point fingers at others there are three fingers pointing you back. Instead of finding faults let us raise others up by helping them to improve.

Prayer was my delight: Prayer should bring out in us a sense of satisfaction and relief. Let us use prayer as a weapon to heal us and to bring about a change in the world that we live in.

Truth cannot be sacrificed for charity. How good it is to confide in Jesus: We need to build relationship with Jesus. 'everything can be sacrificed for the sake of truth, but truth cannot be sacrificed for anything'. Truth makes man discern what is just and proper amidst all evils and superstitions. It makes us very strong both spiritually and intellectually and puts him above all superstitions.

God has impressed on my soul love of truth from my childhood. We should be true religious and not pious teachers: Truth will always set you free. We need to be true to ourselves in thoughts and in our action.

It is good for me that thou have humbled me: Jesus is the ultimate example of humility. He left all glory to come to earth, born in a stable. How often we take pride in showing off for no reason. Let's humble ourselves and simplify our life. Being humble means recognizing that we are not on earth to see how important we can become, but to see how much difference we can make in the lives of others.

The only ambition of a Carmelite should be to surpass the others in humility: To be a leader means to have humility, to have respect and to serve the people that we are leading. And that type of character, that type of integrity not only brings real fulfilment to our hearts, but also has a great effect on the lives of all the people around us.

Make yourselves small, and remain very small, for there is always place for little ones.



LIFE OF MOTHER VERONICA

Venerable Mother Veronica was Constantinople, on 1st October, 1823. Her father was Henry Daniel Leeves and mother was Marina Haultain. She had four siblings. The eldest in the family was her brother Henry; she was the second child, followed by three sisters Mary Ann, Emilie and Catherine. Sophie was brought up in a deeply pious family that appreciated and nurtured values like truth, forgiveness, love and compassion. She learnt to deal both with the rich and the poor with equal grace. Her mother was keen that her children received a good education. Social concern was instilled in the children by Mrs. Leeves who was very charitable to the poor. Each one of them had to adopt a poor girl for whom they sewed clothes. The material was bought from the money they set aside through their sacrifices. The first crisis that left the family shattered was the death of Sophie's father, Henry Daniel Leeves, when she was twenty-two years old. After the death of Mr. Leeves, the family left Athens for England. Shortly after, a young English Naval Officer proposed to Sophie. Her mother consented and she was engaged to him even though the marriage was to take place after two years. She says that he was very good, but she felt in the depths of her heart that something was lacking in her. Sophie prayed and discovered that God wanted her to become a Nun. She wrote to him to free her from her engagement as she wished to belong fully to God. Though sad, he accepted her request. Sophie gave away all her beautiful dresses and jewels and began to wear very simple dresses. While at Malta, Sophie loved to pray in the Cathedral at Valetta. Sophie and her sister Mary Ann were baptized by Father Seagrave and became Catholics. In 1851, Sophie became a nun in the Congregation of St. Joseph of the Apparition. She took the name Sister Mary Veronica of the Passion. Sister Veronica received an order by her Superior General to find a New House of St. Joseph's Congregation at Calicut on the coast of Malabar in India. The French Embassy offered Sister Veronica and her companion a free passage up to Galle, Sri Lanka, on a war-ship called the Rhone. After a long but adventurous and happy journey they arrived at Sri Lanka. From there they had to leave the Rhone and travel by a French merchant vessel to India. Finally, they reached the Indian shores where a group of nearly 50 Indians, were waiting for them. Realizing that she had finally landed in India, as Sister Veronica got off the boat, she prostrated herself on the shore and kissed the earth. Sister Veronica was summoned to Calicut by Monsignor Michael Antony, who wished to erect a new foundation with a school there. The school started flourishing.


The children were transformed in every way with the education they received. Sister Veronica also visited families and rendered help to those in need. However, she heard an interior voice repeatedly, that said to her "I want you in Carmel". At first she tried to ignore it not knowing what it all meant. But it persisted, so she tried to find out the meaning of the voice she heard through prayer and discovered that God was asking her to begin a new congregation of Carmel. Though Sister Veronica was happy as a sister of St Joseph of the Apparition, she had to leave the congregation to found the new Carmel, Sister Veronica left India for Carmel, at Pau, in France. There she would spend two years before she would begin the foundation for the new Carmel.

After two years, Sister Veronica went out into the unknown to found the new Congregation. She faced rejection; some thought her to be an adventuress. However, for Sister Veronica, obedience to God's will has of supreme importance. Finally, in a place called Bayonne in the South of France, she found a small house which was approved by the Bishop. On July 16th 1968 the Apostolic Carmel was founded in Bayonne with a small group of European girls who wanted to become sisters. As Mother Veronica taught in Calicut, India, as a Sister of St Joseph earlier, her heart was set on India. She sent three of the European Sisters, Sister Marie Des Agnes, Sr Teresa and Sr Elias, whom she trained at Bayonne, to India. The Apostolic Carmel was established in St Ann's Convent Mangalore, India on 19th November 1870. The sisters started the Teacher Training Institute first and then schools. Later they took charge of St. Joseph's school, Calicut and opened schools along the West Coast of India. The Apostolic Carmel Schools became known for their quality education that they imparted. Mother Veronica corresponded with the Apostolic Carmel Sisters in India, encouraging and advising them. By now Mother Veronica became feebler. However, she always thought of her Sisters in India. As the days passed she knew that her end was approaching but she remained calm and peaceful. On 16th November 1906, Mother Veronica passed away at the age of 83.















Sophie and Mary Ann receive baptism and Holy Communion at Church of Gesu, Malta by Fr. Seagrave on 2nd Feb. 1850

Sophie receives the habit and took the name Sister Mary Veronica of the Passion.


Robbers killed Sr. Veronica's brother Henry and sister-in-law









1880 Holy Angels' branches off from Apostolic Carmel, Mangalore, to remain belong to the Carmelite Father's and its tradition


Mother Veronica Completes her Autobiography

First and foremost, we would like to express our gratitude to Almighty God for His divine grace and blessings, without which this magazine would not have been completed successfully.



The Teacher's Work 6 Days A Week

It's not uncommon for teachers to clock in extra hours each day to ensure they meet students' academic and social-emotional needs. But everything from answering emails to grading papers adds up: A typical teacher works about 54 hours a week—with just under half of that time devoted to directly teaching students

Teacher dissatisfaction appears to be at an all-time high. While teachers have always, to an extent, known that good teaching takes a lot of time, and workloads overall have increased over the years. They have to juggle regular teaching duties with covering classes during staffing shortages; preparing for sudden pivots to remote learning, figuring out how to get every student to gradelevel learning after interrupted instruction; and supporting students with greater mental health needs. In general, teachers work more than 40 hours a week during normal times, and this is anything but normal But if you take a closer look at what actually goes into good teaching, how much time that takes, and how teachers are compensated for that work, you'll find that teachers' work weeks are in many ways just as taxing, if not more so, than in other careers, and that they receive much lower pay and less public respect, The general public needs to consider that teachers' work doesn't end with the day's final school bell. And it's not just about lecturing at the front of the classroom Teachers look at data to assess how students' learning is progressing and where they need to be. They care for the well-being of multiple children at a time. They may not teach in the summer, but they review curriculum, study and understand academic standards, learn about and prepare to use new research-based learning strategies, and more.

"A good teacher is constantly developing and growing and that does take time, as a teacher, you're more than just a teacher. We're parents, we're friends, we're counsellors, and I think we have this drive in us that we just push forward no matter what's going on, "And sometimes it's at the detriment of our own mental health and our own stress."


Importance of Friendship



Health Is Where Home-made Food Is


